

## Lake Berryessa Recreational Development Update

Drew Lessard of the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation says his agency and Napa County are "this close" to wrapping up an agreement for the county to oversee Lake Berryessa resort revitalization. Lessard said he feels confident a version meeting the Bureau's local and legal perspectives can be completed by the end of February.

Supervisor Alfredo Pedroza during the latest update said people at the lake have had high hopes the county can improve the Berryessa resort situation. "The longer we prolong it, the less hopeful they become," Pedroza told Bureau officials. "I want to look you in the eye and say, 'I do not want to let them down.'"

Lessard said the local economy and recreation are important for the Department of the Interior, which his agency is under. "We want to bring this thing home, not just for you, not just for the department and Reclamation, but also for the (people) who live up there," Lessard said.

If so, that could allow the Napa County Board of Supervisors to consider an agreement in March. County staff continues to work diligently with the Bureau of Reclamation to finalize the Managing Partner Agreement (MPA), which would allow the County to take over responsibilities of recreation management at Lake Berryessa for up to seven concession areas for a 55-year term, expected to begin November 2020.

Once the MPA is finalized, the County anticipates releasing a Request for Proposal in April/May 2020 for the first three concession areas - Steele Park, Spanish Flat, and Monticello Shores.

Long negotiations have entered what

appears to be a slow-motion finish. Deputy County Executive Officer Molly Rattigan said the two parties are working on legal language.

"Words matter," Rattigan said. "And we need to make sure these words really work well for both sides and clearly articulate what we're trying to accomplish."

The parties are really trying to resolve one issue, Rattigan said. That involves giving concessionaires the assurances they need to obtain financing for infrastructure and improvements. Pedroza agreed that words matter. Outcomes also matter, he said.

## Managing Partner Agreement Terms

The Managing Partner Agreement (MPA) is for Napa County (County) to take over responsibilities of recreation management at Lake Berryessa for up to 7 concession areas. The term of the MPA is 55 years. The term of the MPA assumes the County will seek development opportunities beyond basic campgrounds and includes a full array of services including marinas.

Reclamation agreed to provide financial assistance to the County during the early phases of the recreation management while the County brings on partners to develop some of the concession areas.

Reclamation will provide financial assistance for the initial 5 years of the MPA. Financial assistance will be provided under the cost share authorities and requirements of Public Law 89-72 as amended (50% of losses). Reasonable adjustments to the annual financial assistance amounts may be made as mutually agreed.

The funding levels were determined under the assumption that the County will

take management of three sites (Steele, Monticello and Spanish Flat) and make a good faith effort in regards to exercising the option to bring the existing concessionaires at Markley Cove and Pleasure Cove under the MPA.

The funding provided will be in the following order:

Year 1 of the MPA - Reclamation will provide up to \$150,000.00 to offset the County's operating cost of recreation management at Lake Berryessa.

Year 2 of the MPA - Reclamation will provide up to \$250,000.00 to offset the County's operating cost of recreation management at Lake Berryessa.

Year 3 of the MPA - Reclamation will provide up to \$250,000.00 to offset the County's operating cost of recreation management at Lake Berryessa.

Year 4 of the MPA - Reclamation will provide up to \$250,000.00 to offset the County's operating cost of recreation management at Lake Berryessa.

Year 5 of the MPA - Reclamation will provide up to \$150,000.00 to offset the County's operating cost of recreation management at Lake Berryessa.

Effective at the signing of the MPA, Reclamation will provide ½ FTE (Full Time Employee) of a Recreational Planner to provide technical support through the Request for Proposal (RFP), bid selection, and award process to the County team during the first few years of County recreation management at Lake Berryessa. This will be at no cost to the County and will not be deducted from or considered a part of the agreed upon financial assistance.

Reclamation will provide office spaces and utilities to the County team for the first 5 years of the MPA. Office space

will consist of one office, unfurnished. Utilities will include electrical service, water, wastewater, and telephone line. This will be at no cost to the County and will not be deducted from or considered a part of the agreed upon financial assistance.

Under the MPA, the County will be responsible and for the following based on the agreed upon date for each site:

Recreation management for up to 7 concession areas, including solicitation of business opportunities, negotiation and execution of contracts, quality assurance monitoring, and, as necessary, corrective actions to bring contractors into compliance.

Steele Canyon, Monticello Shores, and Spanish Flat will be included November 1, 2020. Pleasure Cove, and Markley Cove will be included upon County exercising an option on or before November, 2030.

Berryessa Point and Putah Canyon will be optional sites if the County decides to include them into their portfolio through a subsequent mutual agreement with Reclamation

**Fire Management** – The County will be responsible for the development and implementation of a fire management plan, including any agreements necessary for fire suppression and for fuel management for the areas managed by Napa County.

**Law Enforcement** – The County will be responsible for providing Law Enforcement for the areas managed by the County under the MPA. Reclamation will fund a minimum of one law enforcement officer through an Enhanced Services Agreement for 5 years for enhanced law enforcement services to federally manager areas. The Enhanced Services Agreement will be brought to the Board of Supervisors for approval at the same time as the MPA.

**Hazardous Materials & Waste management** – the County will be responsible and for overseeing concessionaire use of hazardous materials and generating hazardous waste including all necessary permitting as well as managing any errors that arise. Reclamation retains responsibility for cleaning up any existing issues.

**Water and Waste Water**– The County will be responsible for providing potable water and manage waste water, waste water permits, waste water, and water quality violations within areas managed by the County under the MPA.

**Timeline** – Phasing the concession sites under the MPA by the County:

Phase 1 – (November 1, 2020) The County will take over recreation management responsibility for Steele Canyon,

Monticello Shores, and Spanish Flat. Phase 2 – By or before November 1, 2030, The County will determine whether it will exercise an option to take over the recreation management responsibility for Pleasure Cove and Markley Cove.

Phase 3 – The County may take over the recreation management responsibility for Berryessa Point and Putah Canyon.

**Termination** - Reclamation will reserve the rights to terminate the MPA in the event of a national emergency, if the County fails to provide appropriate recreation activities or meet its commitments under this agreement or under provisions listed in the MPA.

County shall have the right to terminate for convenience its rights and obligations in connection with any concession areas without a concessionaire upon 90 days’ notice.

#### **Scientific Evidence: Cell Phone Safety**

The state of scientific knowledge continues to demonstrate that the current limit on radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission remains acceptable for protecting the public health. The FDA recently provided an updated assessment of the current limits based on the currently available scientific evidence. To date, there is no consistent or credible scientific evidence of health problems caused by the exposure to radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones

The FDA’s doctors, scientists and engineers continually monitor the scientific studies and public health data for evidence that radio frequency energy from cell phones could cause adverse health effects. If a credible risk is detected, the FDA will work closely with other federal partners to mitigate the risk.

The gold standard for the assessment of risk to public health remains the data and information that is available from studying effects on humans. The currently available epidemiological studies, public health surveillance data, and supportive laboratory studies on cell phone radiation provide abundant evidence to support the

FDA’s determination.

As part of ongoing monitoring activities, the FDA analyzes published epidemiological studies for specific outcomes including brain and other tumors as well as for any evidence of other adverse events. No clear and consistent pattern has emerged from epidemiological studies. Based on the evaluation of the currently available information, the FDA believes that the weight of the scientific evidence does not support an increase in health risks from radio frequency exposure from cell phone use at or below the radio frequency exposure limits set by the FCC.

The FDA also monitors the Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) database maintained by the National Cancer Institute (NCI) at the National Institutes for Health (NIH). The SEER data show that brain cancer rates are not increasing in the United States despite the significant increase in the number of cell phone users.

The NCI data clearly demonstrate no widespread rise in brain and other nervous system cancers in the last (nearly) three decades despite the enormous increase in cell phone use during this period. The Pew Research Center estimates that from 2002 to 2019, the percentage of the population owning a cell phone or smartphone has risen from 62 percent to 96 percent, and yet there is a small decrease in brain and other nervous tissue cancer rates.

To date, the scientific evidence indicates

symptoms experienced by people who self-identify as having electromagnetic hypersensitivity occur when the individual believes they are being exposed to radio frequency energy. Based on the available scientific evidence, their very real symptoms are not the result of radio frequency exposures. Many studies have been done to determine if participants can determine if they are being exposed to RF or a sham exposure. The results indicate people cannot sense when they are being exposed to RF.

#### **New Director of Library Services & Community Outreach**

Anthony Halstead has been appointed Napa County’s Director of Library Services & Community Outreach, replacing Danis Kreimeier who retired in December.

Halstead has been with Napa County since May 2009, when he was hired as the Library’s Support Services Manager. He later became Assistant Director.

Halstead has participated in numerous library projects, including the remodel or development of all four library branch locations as well as implementation of new services and programs, both in-person and online.

Prior to joining Napa County, Halstead worked for the Fresno County Library, serving as the Metro Branch Supervisor after being hired as the first World Languages Librarian. He also worked as a reference and adult services librarian in Lewisville, TX.

#### **Recycling Economics Fall Apart**

Unable to absorb new costs, cities are killing recycling programs just as public concerns about climate change ratchet up. China, the biggest buyer of U.S. recycled materials, has closed its doors. Before the ban, the U.S. was exporting around 70% of its waste to China.

Changing consumer behavior has made the trash-sorting process more complex and expensive. The market for recycling has had a lot of shock. Cities are thinking about whether this really worth it.

A major recycling center in the Washington, D.C. suburbs used to turn a healthy profit from processing recycled materials from a 50-mile radius. Now it's having to pay vendors to truck material away, and is re-negotiating decades-old contracts with cities at higher rates — and explaining to consumers why they suddenly have to pay for curbside pick-up. Now that consumers are convinced of the environmental value of recycling programs, most are willing to pay for them.

And cities have to shift from collecting as much recycled material as possible to only the items that have a market. If there's no one in your local area to buy and recycle glass, you spend more fuel and carbon trucking it somewhere that does — and the benefit to the planet falls apart.

There’s not a silver bullet - it’s going to take a number of factors. Reducing the waste stream, reusing more, rethinking how we’re packaging things, and education. Never stop educating the public.

A major recycling center in near Washington, D.C. runs up to 22 hours a day to process the 550 tons of paper, plastic, aluminum and glass that are delivered daily. Despite the heavy machinery and increased automation, the process is still extremely dependent on humans. Researchers are developing robots to more accurately and efficiently complete tedious, dangerous recycling tasks like sorting.

On each shift, 28 "sorters" sift through the material as it rolls down a series of fast-moving conveyer belts. The workers spot and pull out non-recyclable trash from the stream so fast that they look like blackjack dealers.

People throw surprising things — Christmas trees, old carpet, shoes, diapers and even cinder blocks — into their recycling bins. Many cities are struggling to make recycling work. About 60 cities have canceled their programs, according to Waste Dive. Others have stopped accepting certain items. Several no longer collect glass which has zero value.

Baltimore County recently admitted it hasn't recycled the glass it collected for the past 7 years. Costs are skyrocketing: Omaha, Neb., received a single bid for recycling services for \$4 million, twice the city's budget.

#### 4 New Study Finds Direct Link Between Melting Arctic Ice and Extreme Weather In California

For the first time, climate scientists have illustrated a direct cause-and-effect relationship between melting sea ice in the Arctic and the uptick in extreme weather events and "atmospheric rivers" on the Pacific Coast of the U.S.

According to a new paper out of the Scripps Institution of Oceanography, melting ice in the Arctic leads to more moisture getting blown across the Pacific on trade winds, which in turn causes warming ocean temperatures as in El Niños and major disruptions in wind and weather patterns at the equator.

And, as the Chronicle reports from the study, which was published in Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, global climate effects then occur in a chain reaction that begins with the decrease in the amount of sea ice around the North Pole.

"The Arctic is changing rapidly," says Noah Diffenbaugh, a climate scientist at the Woods Institute for the Environment at Stanford University, in a statement to the Chronicle reacting to the study. "The most immediate impacts are for the ecosystem and people in the Arctic, but there is strong evidence of impacts on ... conditions that we experience here in California."

Scientists have long said that warming seas lead to changes in wind circulation patterns and consequent extreme weather in greater frequency. But the Scripps paper marks the first time that the direct causal link from the Arctic has been documented through computer modeling. Previously, scientists did not believe that air from the Arctic could reach as far as the equator, but the Scripps study illustrates that it does.

Saltwater freezes at 28.8 degrees Fahrenheit, and much of the Arctic Ocean beneath its ice sheets is just barely warmer than that. But as the ice melts, the surface temperature can warm quickly because the ice itself reflects the sun, and the less of it there is, the more of the sun's rays get absorbed into the water. It's believed that 40 percent of Arctic sea ice has disappeared in the past 40 years.

Scientists now predict that winter temperatures in

the Arctic will rise 9 degrees over the next 30 years.

According to the study authors, "These results add to the evidence that loss of Arctic sea ice is having a major impact on climatic variability around the world. [And] The magnitude of Arctic sea ice loss and the strength of the Central Pacific trade winds are unprecedented in the instrumental record."

The warming wind patterns may be to blame for a much talked-about "blob" of warm water in the Pacific that appeared multiple times in the last several years, unconnected to El Niño patterns. That blob was blamed for a cascade of effects that included the dying off of kelp forests on the Pacific coast, which in turn caused the die-off of red abalone and an uptick in the deaths of sea otters who no longer had kelp to hide in from sharks.

So, brace yourself for more extreme weather for the rest of your lives, as the temperatures in the Arctic are expected to continue to rise even if the world's most ambitious carbon-reduction goals are met.

There was no fog at blast off, with just a small breeze, and Terry Sheets on the only live National Anthem in California Tournaments was on point! The bite was good for some teams, but most of the teams struggled all day! The lake is fishing tough with all the pressure from recent tournaments and the weights reflect that. Most teams reported catching their fish in 5' - 15' of water and on the bottom. Other teams found a deep bite, I fished about 7 fish at weigh in showing fish being caught deep.

Water temps dropped down to 51-52 range after the winds. Surprisingly the water clarity did not

change much, the winds just moved the fish. Most teams were still fishing all over Main Body of the lake. Reports from the teams are that they are catching fish on Swimbaits, A-rig, Jig, Texas Rig, and Plastics!

First Place went to Carson Leber and Adam Loberg with a 6.13lb kicker for 1st Place Big Fish and that anchored a 14.12lb sack! Second Place went to Luke Lipanovich and Joe Mariani who brought in a sack that weighed 13.67lbs. Third Place went to Brandon Gee and Glen Lockhart with a sack that weighed 12.71lbs. anchored with a 4.82lb kicker for 2nd Place Big Fish. With a Fourth Place finish, Mark Van Pelt and Mike Van Pelt weighed in 11.92lbs.
