
Lake Berryessa Statistics (3/6/22)

The lake level lost a tenth of an inch to 409.9 feet- 30.1 feet below Glory Hole. The lake level has held steady for almost 2 months. The light drizzle over the last two days can hardly be called rainfall and only added .14 inches. The official rainfall total at Monticello Dam is now at 15.98 inches.

We had a slight hailstorm on 2/22/22 but no measurable precipitation. There has been no rain since January 5 - 57 days. This is the longest winter dry spell since 2015. It is also the longest winter dry spell going back to 1993 in the records I can access. This third year of drought as January and February turned out to be two of the driest months in more than 100 years in California according to state water officials.

The Gamble Guage shows the lake is now at 66.3% capacity using the new number approved by the SCWA. See the capacity report at:

The standard capacity was 1,602,000 acre-feet (AF) The new curve has a lake capacity of 1,551,292 AF at a level of 440 feet - 50,708 AF less than previously calculated.




Historical Tidbits

On April 27, 1956, the 84th United States Congress, 2nd session, approved bill S-2775, which named the reservoir behind Monticello Dam. Until then, the reservoir had been referred to as "Monticello Reservoir." From then on, however, it would be known as Lake Berryessa.

All Solano Project construction was essentially finished at the end of 1958. Monticello Dam, Lake Berryessa, and Putah Diversion Dam were all transferred to operative status on July 1, 1959. Lake Berryessa filled on April 18, 1963.

More History - Never Forget!

The Bureau of Reclamation destroyed recreation opportunities at Lake Berryessa for a generation of families and children. Many folks who live at the lake now, as well as others around the Bay Area, don't realize what a disaster the BOR and their fellow travelers perpetrated on the public.

Feds Final Folly: The Destruction of Steele Park Resort - Ten Years Later (2019)

The following story about Steele Park Resort from 2019 (updating an original 2009 piece) is meant to provide some context to the present efforts to revitalize Lake Berryessa.

"As the Bureau of Reclamation's Katrina-like process at Lake Berryessa lurched on to an unknown resolution, local residents and previous lake recreation users were fed up with the Feds. Both Supervisor Diane Dillon and Congressman Mike Thompson were clearly frustrated by their apparent helplessness to do anything about Reclamation's lack of progress in signing the new contract for the five major west shore resorts. The Steele Park Resort contract was especially important since it would have a major impact on the water and sewer rates for

Berryessa Highlands residents which appeared to be headed for a minimum 82% increase by August, 2009.

Four of the resorts had been closed since the middle of summer. Steele Park was shutting down soon and would be demolished during the next nine months. The Pensus Group was chosen in May to manage these five resorts, but Reclamation has been unable to finalize a contract with them since that time. In several public statements, Reclamation claimed that there would be a "seamless transition" and recreation services would be only minimally affected as the resorts were all upgraded and improved. Tragicomically, this did not happened, although the Reclamation refrain has remained, "We are making good progress and expect the contract to be signed soon." The first such statement was made in May, 2008 and last publicly-stated deadline expired with no action."

Tragicomically, the "seamless transition" never happened, although the Reclamation refrain has remained, "We are making good progress and expect the contract to be signed soon." The first such statement was made in May, 2008 and last publicly-stated deadline expired last week with no action.

In a May 19, 2008 letter Reclamation stated: "Based upon evaluation of the successful proposal and subsequent confirmation with the successful offeror, The Pensus Group LLC, Reclamation has determined that all permanent facilities in your Resort concession area must be removed by the end of the concession contract."







Time to Sunset: The Finger Clock

Sure, you could check your watch/phone, if you have one. But maybe it's not working, and even if it is, there's a simple, age-old method you can employ to find out how many daylight hours there are before the sun sets. The cool part is that the only equipment you need is your hand. Keep in mind that this method varies depending on your geographical location. In the north, the sun sets at shallower angles, allowing more usable light than your hands will show. The day will grow dark quicker in the tropics, where the sun sets nearly straight down.
