raised its ugly head with a poorly-written story headlined: "Millions of gallons of sewage water poured into streams near Lake Berryessa." Unfortunately the story was picked up by

many news outlets, especially TV news shows with short attention spans, which left | most precise chaos theory. out the following important points. The overflow was due to clean rain mixed

with fully treated wastewater and the result

was cleaner than the water in the lake itself. Phillip Miller, Napa County's deputy director of public works, said the Berryessa spills did not put the public at risk because

water agencies treat for pathogens.

Alex Rabidoux, a supervising engineer at the Solano County Water Agency, which sells water from Berryessa to cities, said high lake levels this winter mean contamination of drinking water is extremely unlikely

Andrew Altevogt, assistant executive officer at the Central Valley Regiona Water Control Board, said the recent Berryessa spill likely didn't harm people because it was diluted by high creek levels during storms.

Conclusion: This was a non-issue magnified by out-of-context reporting during a time when the community is trying to revitalize this premier recreation destination. The Sacramento Bee seems to have created an new journalistic guideline. replacing the old "If it bleeds, it leads" with "If it poops, it scoops".

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Napa County's 2016 Crops Worth A Record \$737 Million

A record-breaking \$729.5 million value for grapes led the way. Agricultural production value rose 33 percent from 2015. It broke the old record of \$720.8 million set in 2014, with wine grape production breaking the old record of \$714.8 million, also set in 2014.

Weather overall was conducive to a bountiful wine grape harvest. The county received adequate rain during the 2015-16 rain season and had the right conditions at fruit set and harvest. Non-grape growers have a stake in the grape prices since they show that Napa County can support agriculture generally, with values this high.

Olives were a distant second behind grapes in crop value, with value rising from \$300,300 in 2015 to \$456,900. Vegetables fell from 32 acres in 2015 to 26 acres. and production value fell from \$367,700 to \$294,900.

The crop report blamed the tail end of the drought for the dips. Vegetables included artichokes, eggplants, kohlrabi, lettuce, potatoes and turnips.

Napa County's category for non-grape and non-olive fruits and nuts includes apples, pears, plums, pluots, strawberries and walnuts. No acreage figures are listed in the crop report, but production value grew from \$272,300 to \$384,900.

The number of cattle and cows grazed in Napa County grew from 9,100 to 20,480 Value grew from \$1.2 million to \$2.7 million. Sheep and lambs held steady at 4,390, with value falling from \$625,500 to \$614,300.

Still another crop report section looked at floral and nursery production, including lavenders, begonias, poinsettias, vegetable starts, cut flowers and trees. Lake Berryessa's Connection to Outer Space and Inner Space: The Rubins Family of the Berryessa Highands. By Peter Kilkus

Lake Berryessa News readers are familiar, through our reporting, with Astronau Kate Rubins who just returned from outer space a few months ago and was recently honored at a Women in Science event with President Trump. Turns out that Kate has a brother who is working in inner space and taking on the legal system with artificial intelligence (AI). Dan Rubins, 33, is creator and chief executive of

Legal Robot, www.legalrobot.com, a start-up that uses artificial intelligence to translate legalese into plain English. A major impact of A.I. that concerns economists is

job loss - and not only blue collar jobs. What white collar jobs will be lost to artificial intelligence and automation? Researchers are beginning to see that artificial intelligence, robotics, and new disruptive technology are challenging white-collar professions that previously seemed invulnerable. Dan Rubins has a lot of grievances with lawyers. At

his former job, he recalled the time when six corporate lawyers, each billing at hundreds of dollars an hour, were inspecting a contract looking for capitalization errors. It's what prompted him to create Legal Robot, Having reviewed nearly a million legal documents, Legal Robot also flags anomalies, strange wording or clauses in contracts. Mr. Rubins said that A.I. is good at identifying potentially vague word choices, but he doesn't think A.I. will put lawyers out of business.

He said legal documents are well suited to machine learning because they are highly structured and repetitive. Legal Robot tapped a vast trove of contracts prepared by human lawyers in filings with the Securities and Exchange Commission - "a cesspoo of legal language," Mr. Rubins said - as well as past documents from various law firms who wanted to help train Legal Robot's systems.

His start-up company software offers features like:

Instant Error Check: automated contract review which helps understand complex legal language and spot problems - without the time and cost of hiring an attorney

Compare & Collaborate: Evaluates a contract against standards and across industries or jurisdictions, then collaborates with a company's legal team.

Fairness & Risk Analysis: Algorithms assess fairness and risk so all parties can be clear on the terms and confident

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

Where Eagles Dare: Winged Warriors Hunt Down Rogue Drones

aircraft. The use of hunting birds – normally falcons and northern goshawks – by militaries around the globe is common practice in the fight to scare other critters away from runways and so cut the risk of accidents during takeoff or landing. But it wasn't until 2015 when the Dutch started using bald eagles to intercept drones that other militaries started to see the benefit of these winged warriors.

The French chose golden eagle because of the birds hooked beak and sharp eyesight. Also weighing in around 11 pounds, the birds are in a similar weight class as the drones they're sent to destroy and clocking in at a top air speed of 50 miles per hour. They have the capability of spotting a target from more than a mile away and are deft hunters. To protect the eagles from drone blades and any explosive device that might be

attached the them, the French military designed mittens of leather and Kevlar, an antiblast material, to protect the bird's talons.





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
