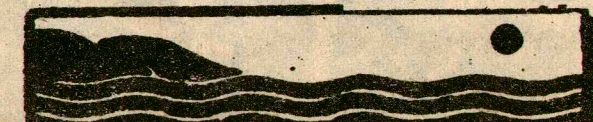

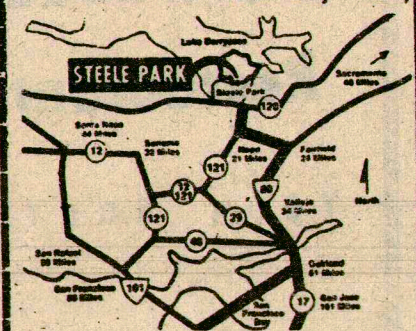

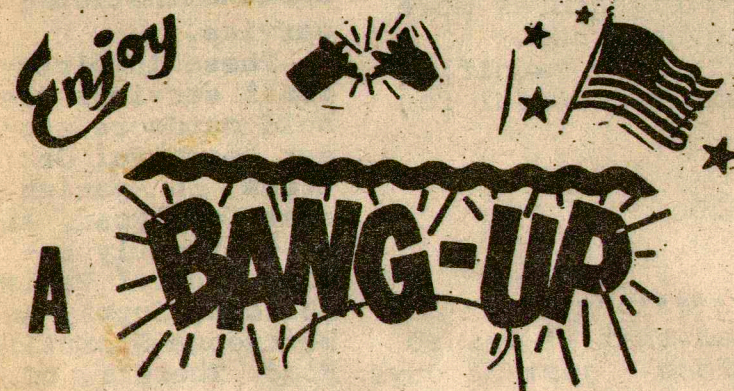

EXTRA LAW ENFORCEMENT Why Some Burned

But Others Didn't

As on other three day weekends, there will be many extra law enforcement officers on duty in the lake area.

On Friday, July 3rd, thru Sunday, July 5th, in addition to extra black and white units, the California Highway Patrol will have four motorcycle officers working in the area, two from Contra Costa County and two from Oakland. These fellows are fast and will be on watch for drivers over the line into wrong lanes, etc. so drive extra, very, very carefully all weekend!

In addition, the Sheriff Department will have extra officers on duty in the area - all to try to keep it safe and sane for everyone to have an enjoyable weekend so give them your cooperation whenever possible.

OF UTMOST IMPORTANCE THIS WEEKEND WILL BE THAT NOBODY, UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES, SET OFF ANY FIREWORKS! THEY ARE ILLEGAL IN THIS AREA - ANYWHERE - SO IT IS ADVISABLE NOT TO PUSH YOUR LUCK! Editor's Note: After a fire, looking back, it is natural to wonder what if things had been different? Why did certain homes burn to the ground while others were saved? Perhaps by looking at that it may save someone the loss in the future, so this is very worthwhile reading: From the CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY comes the following:

"Fifty-two homes were lost on Napa County's Atlas Peak fire. The California Department of Forestry is not satisfied with just noting this fact and then forgetting it. C.D.F. is investigating the reasons why some homes were lost and some saved. Regional Chief Richard Ernest of the C.D.F. North Coast area who instigated the investigation said "we must establish all the factors that relate to these tragic losses."

Several things relate directly to whether a home is lost or saved. First, it must be determined what clearances around the home from flammable vegetation existed prior to the fire. California Public Resources Code 4291 requires a minimum 30' clearance between natural vegetation and any improvement such as a home, garage, or barn. This clearance may go to 100' where the surrounding growth is heavy enough to demand the additional barrier. Some property owners comply with this law, but then make the mistake of substituting ornamental shrubbery that is also highly susceptible to fire.

Second, many homes in wildland areas are built to burn. Several factors worth noting are: the use of wooden roofs, the use of wooden siding, large expanses of glass that allow radiant heat penetration, and the placement of the home on slopes with portions of the home overhanging tinder dry wildland fuels.

Third, fire defense of a wildland home may depend on adequate water supplies for fire fighting purposes: a swimming pool is great if it is built where a fire engine can get close enough to use it. Driveways must be large enough for fire apparatus.

The fire safe considerations mentioned are some of the factors that make a difference. Chief Ernest has stated that C.D.F. must learn from its bad fire experiences to plan legislation and recommendations.

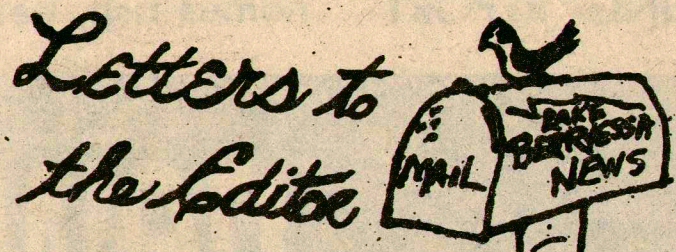

Our deepest sympathy to Viola and the rest of the family!

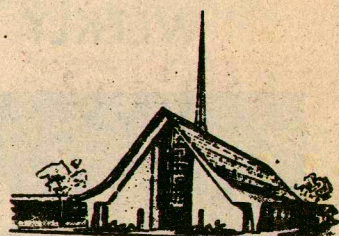

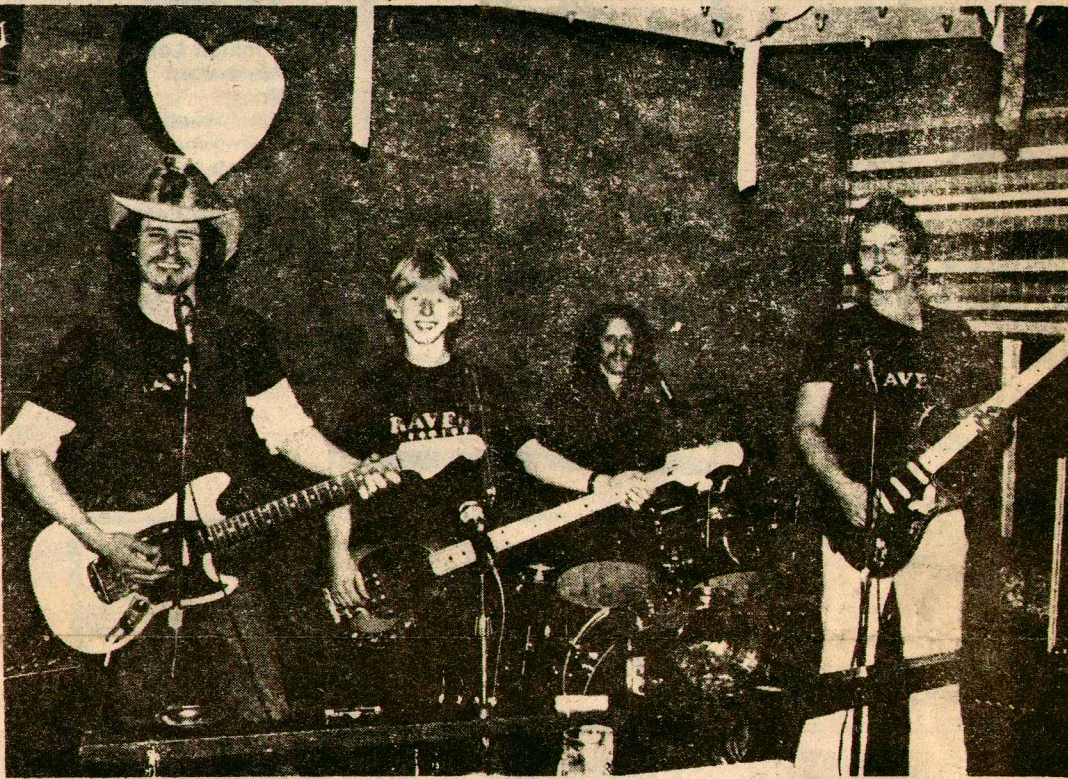

We have had lots of nice fish checked in this week, mostly trout, taken on small trout lures, mainly the spoon type.

Claude Davis and his friends have been getting limits of trout every time out. They go out early to beat the heat. He has been using the new lure, but it is the same as last year, when they gave him some samples of the Pop-R. We took many, many bass on it but could not get delivery on it till after the good fishing was over. Hope they don't wait that long this year! This lure is real good. It gets fish as fast as the Andy Reeker lure, which is no longer on the market.

Most trout have been taken around 45 to 48 feet, but last week I took a few at 65 feet, and one at 35 feet.

The bass are out there, but not too many people are fishing for them.

Cat fishing is good late evening and early mornings. Fish shallow then, but during the day they are deeper, 10 to 20 feet.

Last week a young lad was fishing by a brush pile and was getting a few Blue Gills, and he thought he got a few crappies, but as near as I could tell they may be

Red Ear Perch. They were shaped like Blue Gill, the color was a silver green, and the black spot on the gill cover was outlined in red. Anyone who knows what they are please let me know.

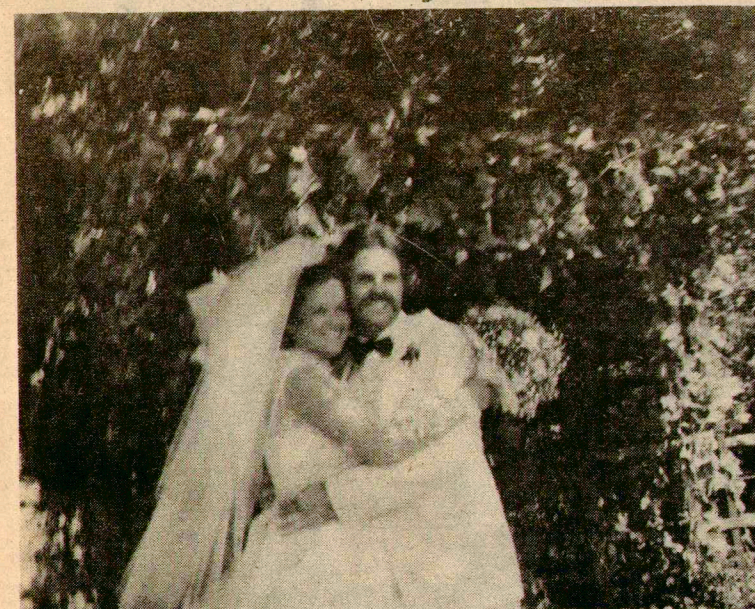
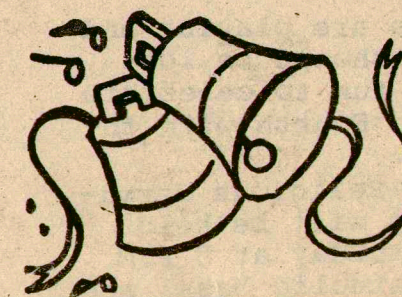

The ladies were in beautiful floral gowns, as was the little Flower Girl, Brooke Robinson. All had lovely floral headgear.

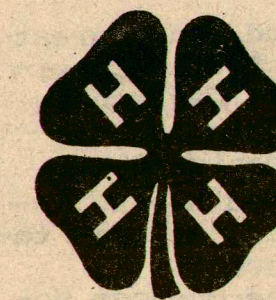

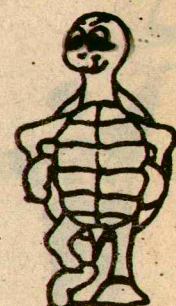

it and had a great time boating, swimming, barbecuing and relaxing. We at Spanish Flat enjoyed having them, and welcome them back.

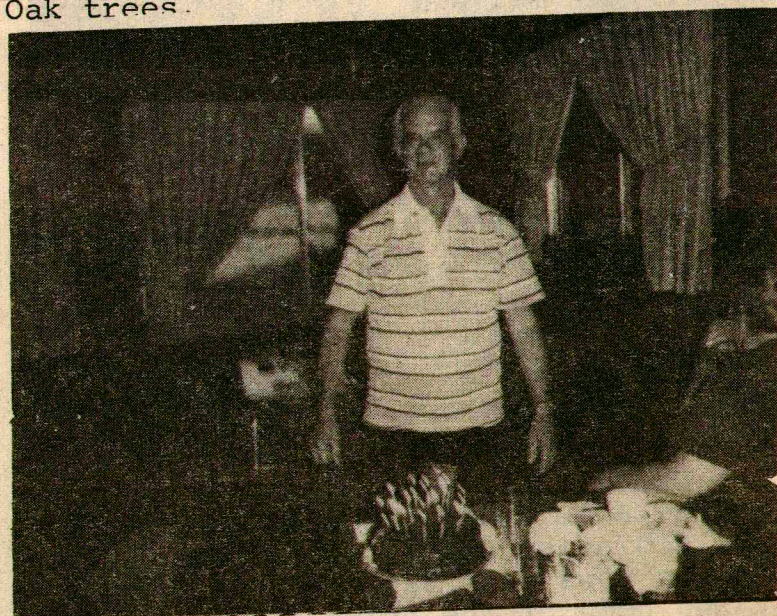

All services of the license section are being transferred to the new site 13 blocks from DFG headquarters at 1416 Ninth St. There is on-street parking at the new location.

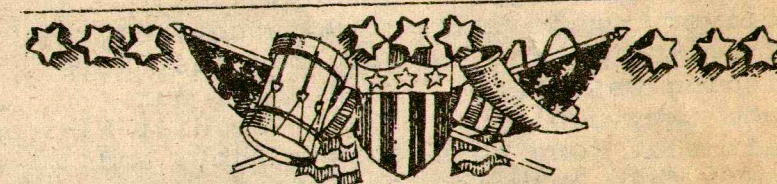

Beware of confused and hungry wildlife after a fire! Watch out for rattlesnakes! Many kinds of animals hide from advancing flames, and after the ashes cool, they emerge to search for food. Skunks, snakes, mice and other small animals will be seen searching for a new place to live. They may be dazed, confused and weak from hunger and thirst. All can be unpredictable and potentially dangerous to people. Don't touch wild animals seen near the burned areas!

For dispatch of injured or dead animals contact Napa County Animal Control, phone (707) 253-4381, during the week and weekends. If there is no answer contact the Sheriff's Office, (707) 253-4501, and they will relay message to Animal Control.
